ARAT Members have started QSLing activity for the QSL Cards received direct as the Tunisian Bureau inside the Scout Organization is encountering some problems.



Our QSL Service is improving and we're working to have some funds to officially launch Tunisia's QSL Bureau.

## Collaboration with National Agency of Frequencies

During this year, ARAT was assisting the Tunisian Administration in redacting the laws organizing the hobby in 3V-land and defining the licensing process for citizens.

The draft has finally passed to the desk of the director of ANF (National Agency of Frequencies) and will be further discussed prior to submission to the National Constitutional Council for approval.

ARAT has also organized a visit of ANF officers to 3V8BB station to further explain the hobby and answer all related questions.

Tunisia application for IARU-R1 Membership is still pending.
